

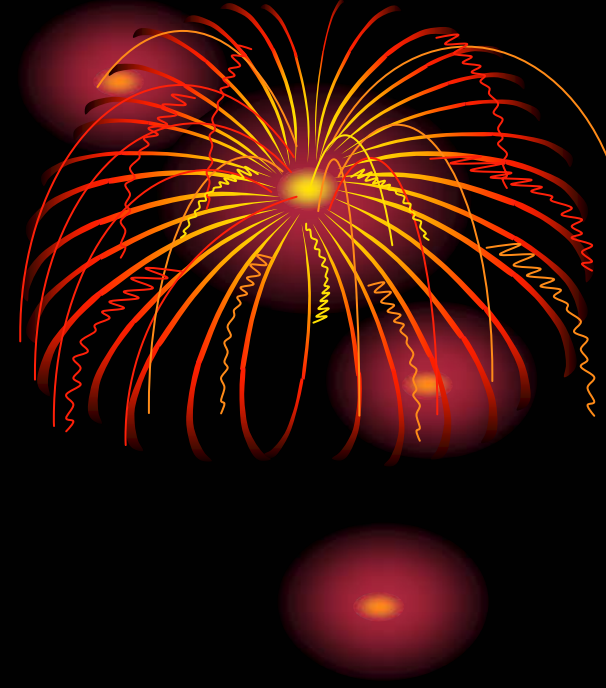

- Community Involvement



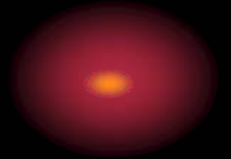
What is a Neighborhood REVITALIZED?

- Increasing wealth for homeowners

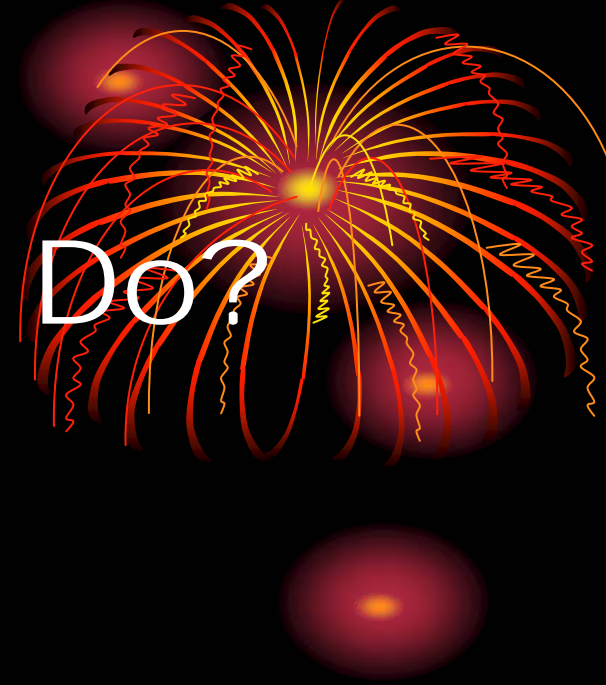


What is a Neighborhood REVITALIZED?

- Isolation ends

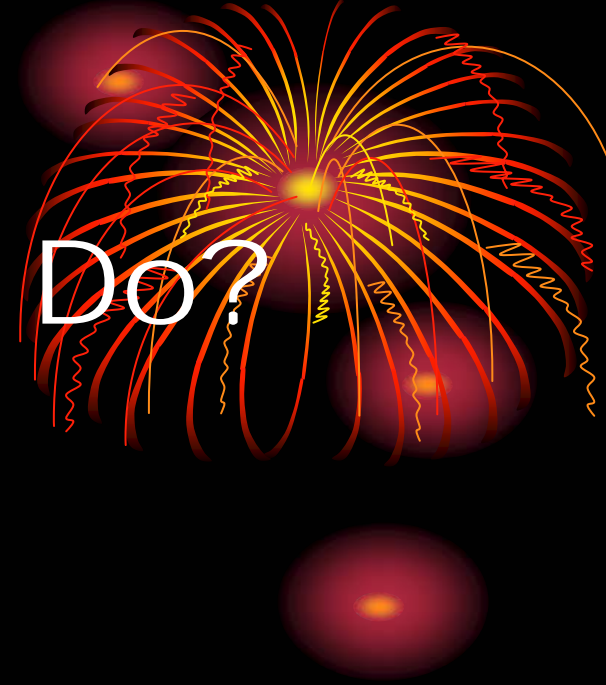


What Can Neighborhoods Do?

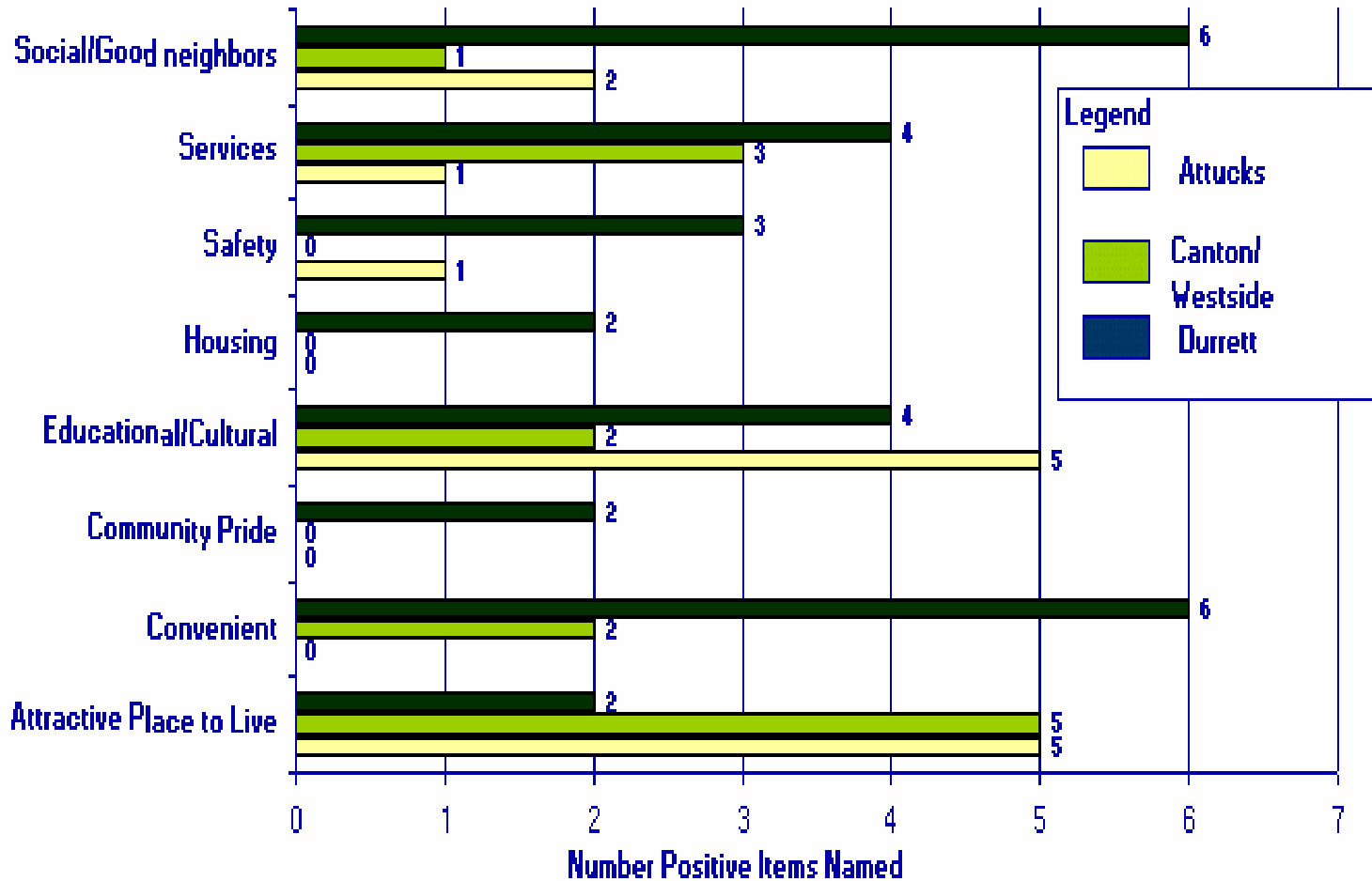

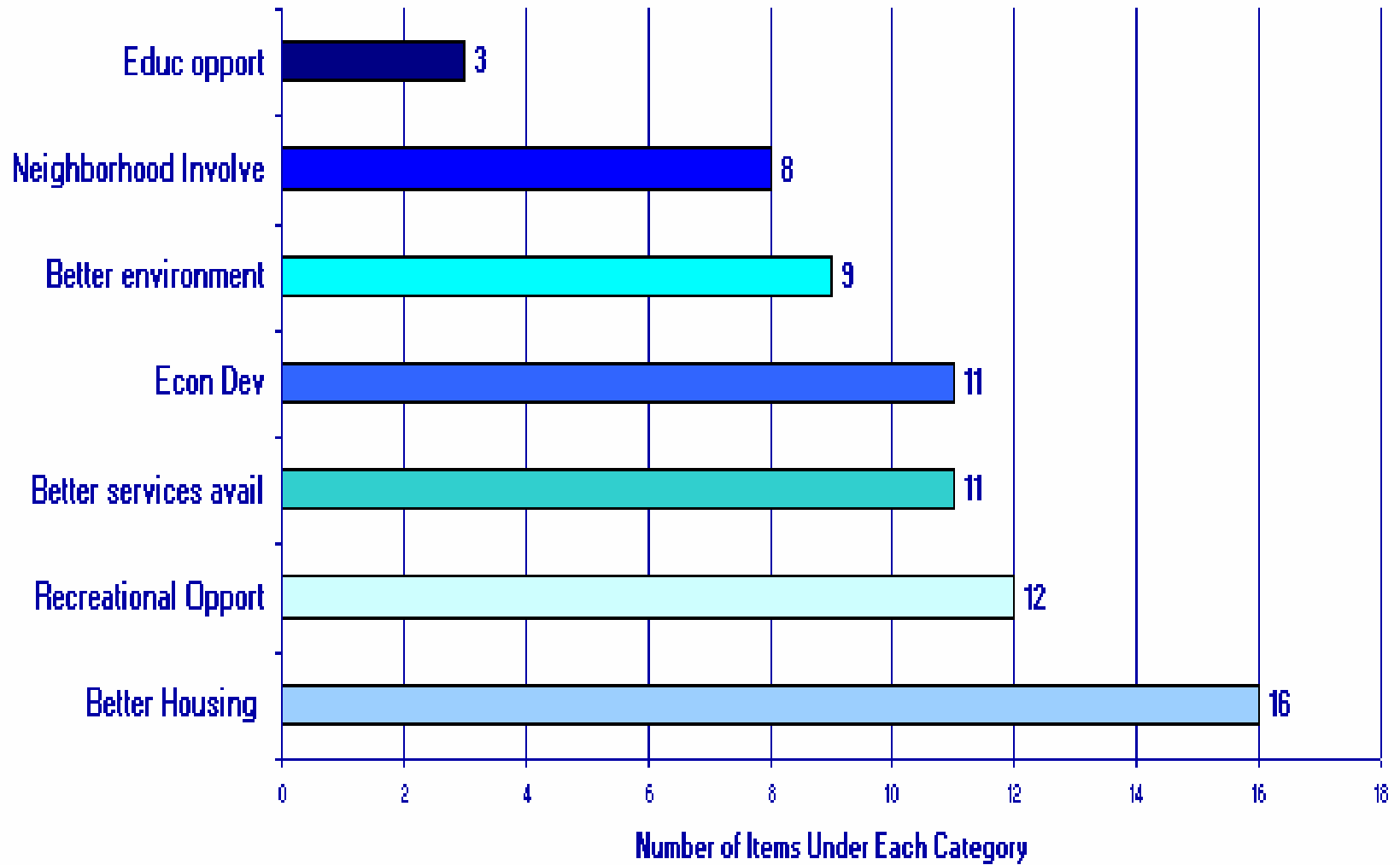

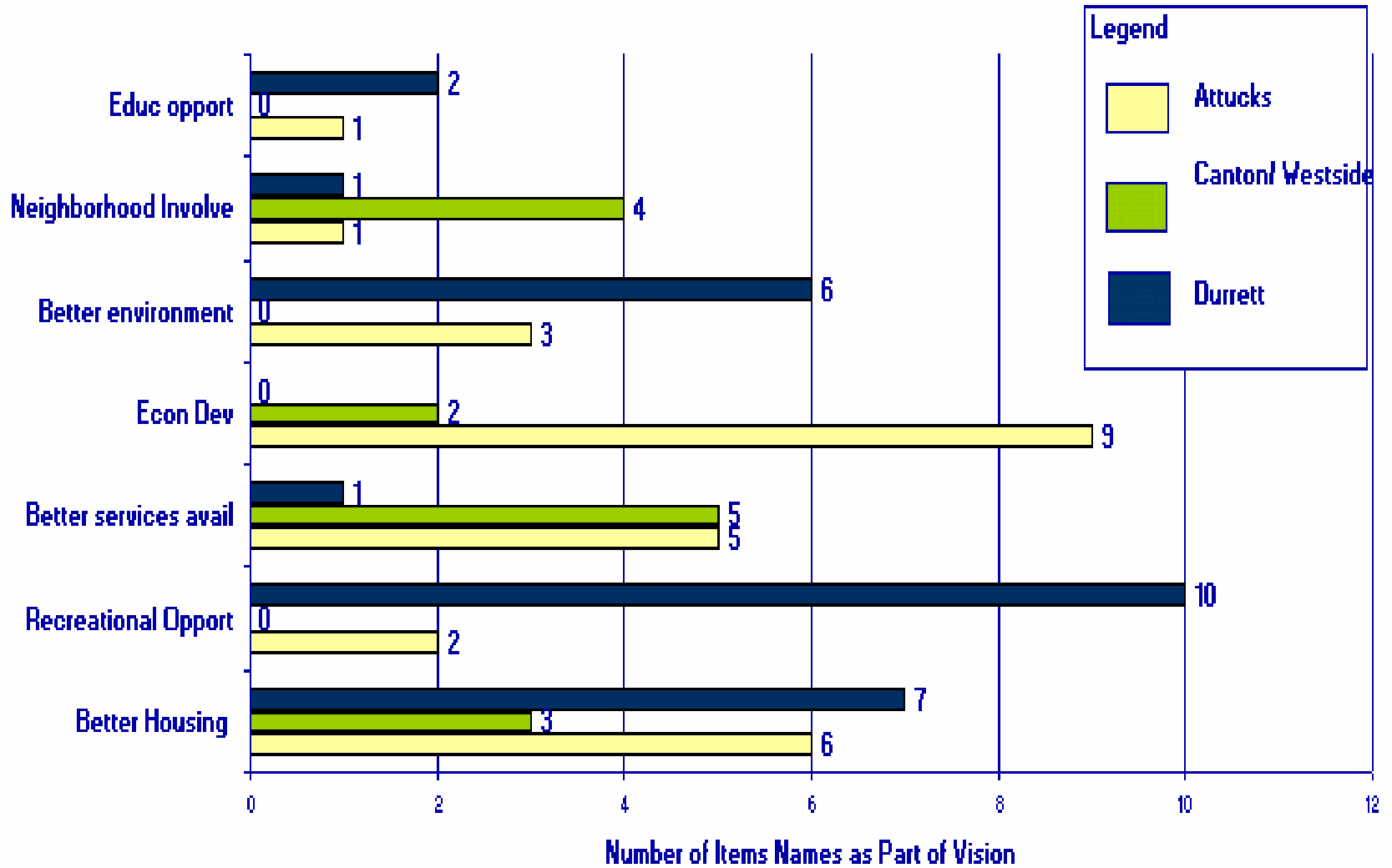

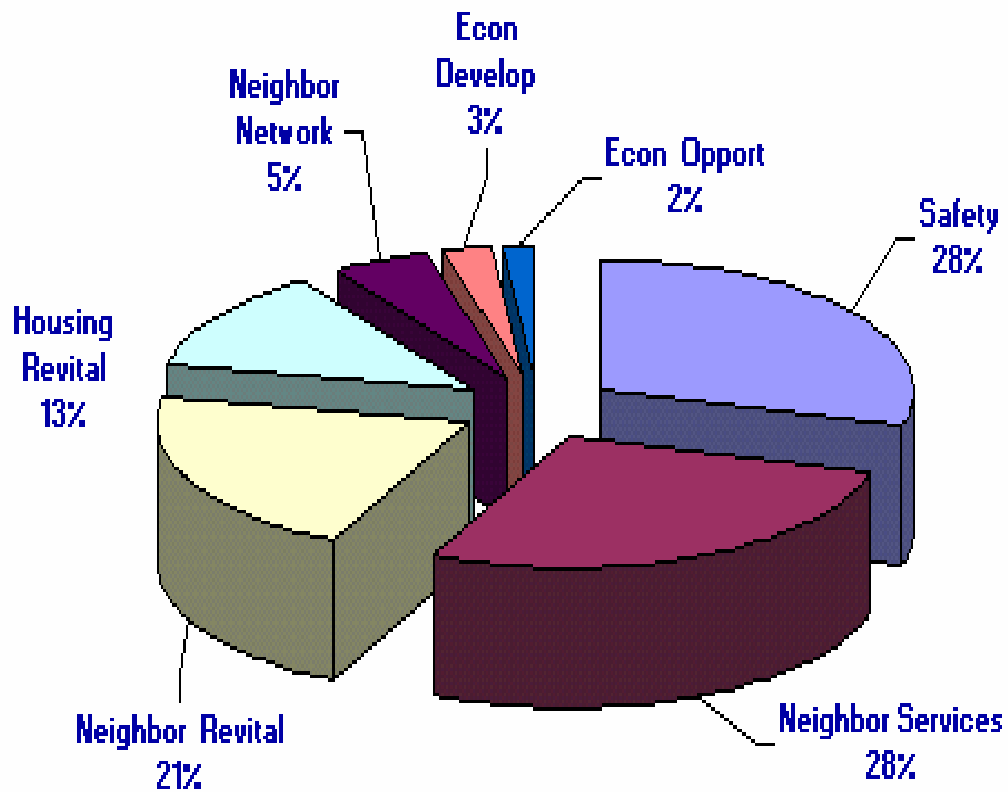

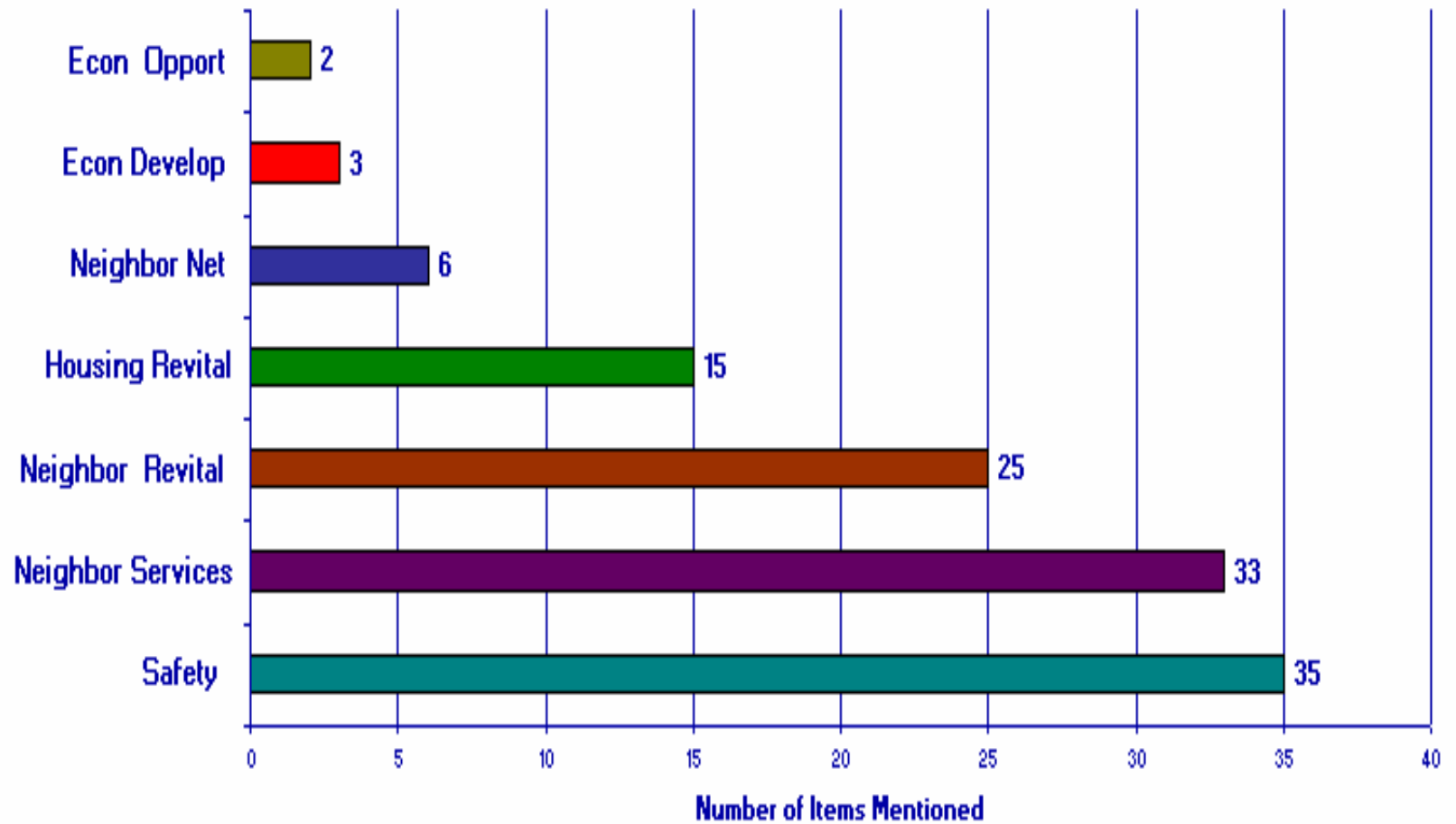

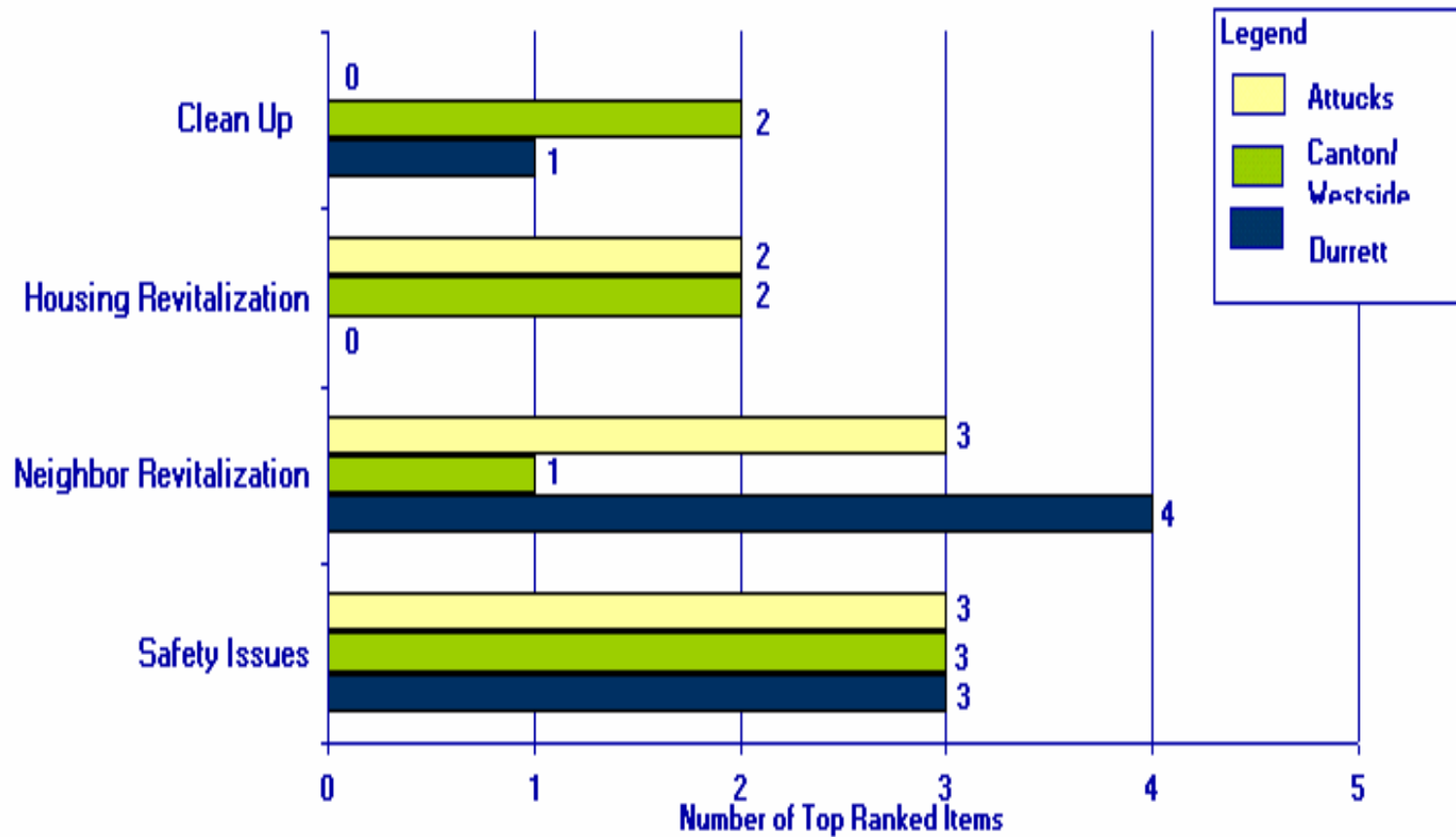

Attucks' Vision

Better Environment

- Stockyard leveled; converted to park
- Clean streets -- "beyond belief"
- Better sidewalks, streets, and lighting

Better Housing

- Everybody owns their homes, including affordable housing, with beautification
- Attucks Neighborhood Network buys out slumlords, improves rental housing or converts to home ownership
- The image of the Attucks/Eastside Neighborhood is positive
- Award winning yards and landscaping
- Larger and better homes have been built on vacant lots
- No more dilapidated houses and vacant lots -- new houses build on these sites

Better Services Available

- Attucks School is the hub of community activities
- The historic Attucks High School has been rehabilitated and converted into a community center
- New churches and a Life Center
- Drainage problems eliminated
- Warehouses gone -- 2-story Sr. retirement center built on site

Economic Development

- Attucks/Eastside Chamber of Commerce established and encourages support of neighborhood businesses
- Eastside shopping mall constructed (not Wal-Mart)
- Attucks Neighborhood Network creates a bank or credit union
- Good jobs and created a new neighborhood

- A strong housing market
- Support of businesses and churches - Neighborhood's economy has improved
- Attucks/Eastside neighborhood creates jobs in the neighborhood
- High level of employment in the neighborhood
- Neighborhood landmarks brighten the community and attract tourists

More Neighborhood Involvement

- Attucks has created an ongoing Neighborhood Network, which is active, meets monthly, and prevents the neighborhood from slipping back
- Attucks Neighborhood Network led a voluntary effort to clean up and maintain the historic African-American Cemetery
- Churches involved in community activities

More Recreational Opportunities

- A second aquatic center build in Attucks/Eastside
- Positive places and activities for kids

Improved Safety

- No more gangs, drugs, crime, and prostitution
- Community policing makes a big difference -- officers know everyone and everyone knows the officers
- Jeffers Bends Environmental Park is open 24/7 and safe
- Safe and Quiet Neighborhood
- A train passes through the neighborhood only once a day
